Project Description

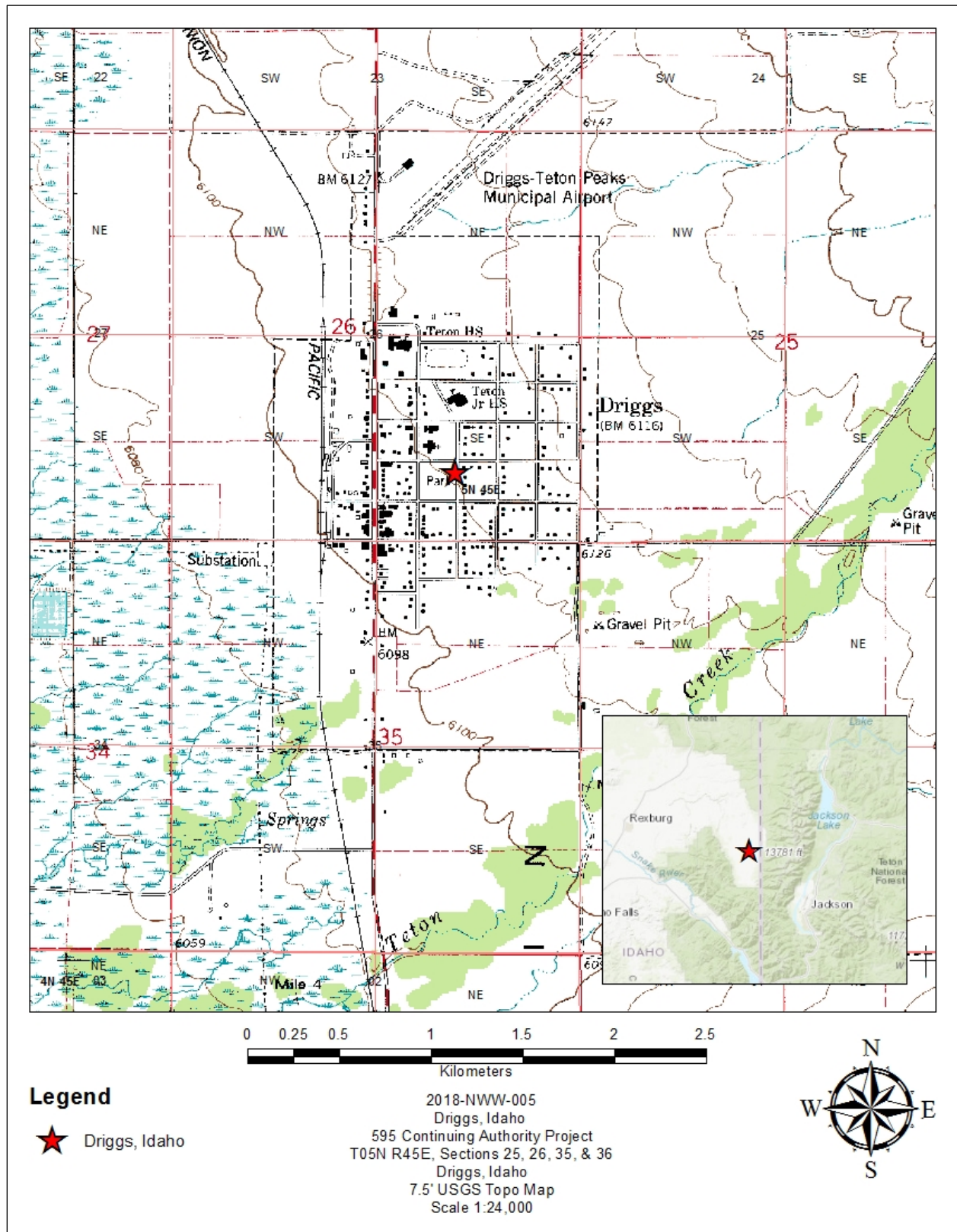


Figure 1: Location map for the Driggs Wastewater Improvement Project.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, (Corps) Walla Walla District proposes to participate in a cost share project with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the City of Driggs, Idaho (Figure 1) in order to rehabilitate the city's wastewater collection and treatment systems. The Corps' proposed action (undertaking) utilizing Section 595 funding will include the remaining contract administration, design, construction management, inspection, and the purchase of telemetry equipment and programming associated with the Driggs Water System Improvement Project. The undertaking will also include an as-built water system map, along with survey and GIS equipment for the City to update the water system map after improvements are completed. Lastly, the Corps' undertaking will include advertising, bidding, and construction of chlorine treatment and generator transfer switch improvements to the City's existing valley Center and Teton Creek Wells.

The proposed work will not require additional water rights, and all construction activity will comply with Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) requirements for surface water protection and groundwater contamination protocols. All construction efforts will be located in previously disturbed urban environments; however, the Corps' undertaking is limited to administrative actions or actions not requiring ground disturbance.

Determination of Effect

The Corps undertaking has been determined to have **No Effect to Historic Properties** and no additional work is necessary. Furthermore, the Corps consulted with the Shoshone-Bannock Tribe and Shoshone-Paiute Tribes regarding this determination on December 6, 2017; however, both tribes elected to not respond (see Appendix A for consultation letters). This concludes the Corps' NHPA Section 106 requirements and the project may proceed as planned.
