


NOT FOR NAVIGATION

(5533) (4) At McNary Lock and Dam. The waters restricted to all vessels, except to Government vessels, are described as all waters commencing at the upstream end of the Oregon fish ladder thence running in the direction of $39^{\circ}28'$ true for a distance of 540 yards; thence $7^{\circ}49'$ true for a distance of 1,078 yards; thence $227^{\circ}10'$ for a distance of 468 yards to the upstream end of the navigation lock guidewall. The downstream limits commence at the downstream end of the navigation lock guidewall thence to the south (Oregon) shore at right angles and parallel to the axis of the dam. Signs designate the restricted areas.

SPECIES**Season****Additional Rules**

CLOSED WATERS - at John Day Dam between the upstream line of John Day Dam to markers approximately 3,000' downstream, except that fishing is permitted up to 400' below the fishway entrance from the Washington shore. At McNary Dam between the upstream line of McNary Dam downstream to a line across the river from the red and white marker on the Oregon shore on a line that intersects the downstream end of the wingwall of the boat lock near the Washington shore.

SALMON AND STEELHEAD - Aug. 1-Oct. 15: anti-snagging rule.

TROUT

Release all TROUT except hatchery STEELHEAD (see below).

WALLEYE

Year-round

No min. size. Daily limit 10. Up to 5 over 18" and only 1 over 24" may be retained.

BASS

Year-round

No min. size. Daily limit 5. Up to 3 over 15" may be retained.

CHANNEL CATFISH

Year-round

No min. size. No daily limit.

Other Game Fish

Year-round

Statewide min. size/daily limit.

SALMON &
STEELHEAD

June 16-July 31

SALMON minimum size 12". Daily limit 6. Up to 2 may be adult SALMON or hatchery STEELHEAD or 1 of each. Release all SALMON other than hatchery CHINOOK and SOCKEYE.

SALMON &
STEELHEAD

Aug. 1-Dec. 31

SALMON minimum size 12". Daily limit 6. Up to 2 may be adult SALMON or hatchery STEELHEAD or 1 of each. Release all SALMON other than CHINOOK and COHO.

STEELHEAD

Jan. 1-Mar. 31

Min. size 20". Daily limit 2.

STURGEON May 1-July 31: **CLOSED** to fishing for STURGEON from John Day Dam downstream 2.4 miles to the west end of the grain silo at Rufus, Oregon.

May 1-July 31: **CLOSED** to fishing for STURGEON from McNary Dam downstream 1.5 miles to Hwy. 82 (Hwy. 395) Bridge.

STURGEON

Jan. 1-July 31

Min. size 43" fork length. Max. size 54" fork length. Daily limit 1. End date depends on quota being met.

STURGEON

Aug. 1-Dec. 31

Catch-and-release.

Bonneville Dam upstream to Oregon/Washington border located upstream of McNary Dam</p> <p>(Continued from previous page)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Only single-point hooks allowed when angling at Cascade Locks in the area between the boat ramp at the lower end of the locks upstream to the east (upstream) end of the lock wall.• When angling for <i>bass</i> above McNary Dam:<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. <i>Largemouth bass</i>: 5 fish per day, no minimum size limit. Only <i>Largemouth bass</i> less than 12 inches may be retained, except 1 over 17 inches may be retained as part of the daily limit.• Closed:<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Bonneville Dam upstream to a line across the river 1,000 feet from the dam as indicated by USACE signs;2. Interstate Hwy 197 bridge at The Dalles upstream to the upper line of The Dalles Dam, except bank angling is permitted upstream from the highway bridge for 1,100 feet to the cyclone fence;3. John Day Dam downstream about 3,000 feet except that bank angling is permitted up to 600 feet below the fishway entrance;4. From a floating device in USACE designated hazard zones above and below McNary Dam.
