Revision to Joint Application for Permit

Joint Application for Permit Revised

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Walla Walla Regulatory Division and the State of Idaho have revised its Joint Application for Permit, *effective immediately*. The primary purpose of the revised Joint Application is to streamline the application process by incorporating informational data needs necessary to evaluate Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 401 Water Quality Certification. In accordance with 33 CFR 325, anyone requesting a CWA Section 404 permit to discharge dredged and/or fill material into a water of the United States, including wetlands, must also obtain a Section 401 Water Quality Certificate or Waiver of Certificate. Information provided in this section will assist the appropriate entity in their evaluation for an individual water quality certification or a waiver of certification.

The accompanying *Instruction Guide* to the Joint Application for Permit has also been revised and details how to complete the application block by block. It also includes examples and calculations and can be viewed at http://www.nww.usace.army.mil/Portals/28/docs/regulatory/JtApplication/Instruction%20Guide.pdf. The associated *Drawings and Illustrations* (vicinity map, plan view and cross section) remain unchanged and are still required as part of a complete application packet.
