The Golden Age and the Golden Access Passports will no longer be issued after **01 January 2007**. They are being replaced with the new *America the Beautiful Pass* program created by the Federal Lands Recreation Enhancement Act of 2004, passed by Congress. Under the new legislation the National Park Service, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forest Service, the Bureau of Land Management, and the Bureau of Reclamation are the only ones allowed to issue the new pass. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers was not included in the new *America the Beautiful Pass* program authority. Therefore, the Corps is not authorized to issue the new passes but is being allowed to honor associated discounts for *America the Beautiful Senior or Access Pass* holders that acquire their pass from any of the above mentioned agencies. Any current Golden Age or Golden Access Passports are still good for the lifetime of the owner. If at anytime the Golden Age or Golden Access Passport is lost, stolen or worn out it will have to be replaced by the new *America the Beautiful Senior or Access Pass*.

DIRECTIONS TO HANFORD REACH NATIONAL MONUMENT



From Hood Park, Charbonneau Park, and Fishhook Park

1. Follow **Highway 124** to Highway 12
2. Follow **US-12 West** for 13.5 miles
3. Take the **George Washington Way** exit (EXIT 5-B)
4. Merge onto **George Washington Way**, follow 6.0 miles
5. Turn right onto **11th Street**, follow 0.1 miles
6. Turn right onto **Port of Benton Blvd**, follow <0.1 miles
7. End at **3250 Port of Benton Blvd**.

**The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Office is located through the double glass doors and is the first office door to your left.*

From Windust Park

1. Follow **Burr Canyon** to the Pasco Kahlotus Highway
2. Follow the **Pasco Kahlotus Highway West**, follow for 31.4 miles
3. Merge onto **US-12 West** toward I-182 West, follow 10.6 miles
4. Take the **George Washington Way** exit (EXIT 5-B)
5. Merge onto **George Washington Way**, follow 6.0 miles
6. Turn right onto **11th Street**, follow 0.1 miles
7. Turn right onto **Port of Benton Blvd**, follow <0.1 miles
8. End at **3250 Port of Benton Blvd**.
