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## Walla Walla District U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Winter Schedule for Recreational Craft Lockage

The winter recreational craft lockage schedule will be effective beginning 16 September 2003. This schedule is in place for water conservation and heightened security after 11 September 2001, at Walla Walla District projects. This act will conserve water necessary for fish, irrigation, and power generation and offer lockages during daylight hours.

The winter schedule will provide three lockages a day, upstream and downstream at each of the District's five navigation locks as listed below. The three Portland District locks on the Columbia River; Bonneville, The Dalles and John Day will use the same lockage schedule that Walla Walla District has implemented for upstream and downstream lockages.

When a recreational vessel lockage schedule is in effect, recreational vessels will only be allowed to lock through at the times designated for such lockages and they will take precedence over commercial vessels. Commercial vessels will continue to be locked through upon arrival except during the times specified for recreational vessel lockages. At the discretion of the lock operator, recreational vessels may be allowed to lock through with commercial craft.

All vessel owner/operators lock through at their own risk. Follow the directions of the lock operator when using the locks or operating in the vicinity of the locks. The lock operator has final authority on the suitability of a craft for lockage. Please refer to U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Safe Lockage Policy for Recreational Craft on the Columbia and Snake Rivers, published separately, for additional safety requirements.
