## **The eagles have landed at Dworshak Dam and Reservoir; Cold Springs Group Camp, Merrys Bay temporarily closed**

**OROFINO, Idaho** – U.S. Army Corps of Engineers natural resource managers say the eagles have landed at Dworshak Dam and Reservoir and they are under the influence of spring. Two pairs of nesting bald eagles have been observed near the Cold Springs Group Camp and Merrys Bay.

To help the nesting eagles, Cold Springs Group Camp and Merrys Bay are temporarily closed, along with approximately one-half mile of the trails to the camps.

Areas posted include the trailhead at Dent Bridge; on the trail approximately one-quarter mile east of the Cold Springs Campground; on the trail east of minicamp 12.4; the trailhead at Merrys Bay; the trailhead at Bruce's Eddy; and on the shoreline surrounding these areas. The areas are also closed to boat traffic.

Maps of these closures are posted at all boat ramps at Dworshak Reservoir.

The area is now posted as closed.

“We request the public's help for the prospective parents by respecting the temporary closures and reporting any violations to the Corps,” said Russ Davis, Wildlife Biologist.
