Corps' Boise Regulatory Office to move Dec. 1

BOISE, Idaho – On Dec. 1, the Boise Regulatory Office will move from the Borah Post Office Building in downtown Boise to a new location on Emerald Street.

The new address, located in the same building currently occupied by the National Marine Fisheries Service, offers off-street parking and a lower cost for rent, said Walla Walla District's Regulatory Division Chief Brad Daly.

“Our current lease runs out in 2008, so we looked around and found this space that offers improved accessibility for the public with cost savings on the lease,” said Daly, adding, “We will be retaining all of our current telephone numbers.”

The new office can be easily accessed from the I-184 Connector by taking the Franklin Road exit. From there, proceed west on Franklin Road, turn right (north) on Five Mile Road, then right (east) on W. Emerald to Ancestor Lane. The receptionist inside the front door of the building will be able to direct visitors to our offices.

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers administers its regulatory program in the State of Idaho through the Walla Walla District Office located in Walla Walla, Washington. The Boise Regulatory Office was established in 1984 to better serve the public in southwestern Idaho. The Boise Regulatory Office processes Department of the Army permits required under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 and Section 404 of the Clean Water Act. Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899 requires that a Department of the Army permit be issued for structures or work in navigable waters of the United States. Section 404 of the Clean Water Act requires that a Department of the Army permit be issued for the placement of dredged or fill material, including some excavation activities, in most surface waters and wetlands.

The Boise Regulatory Office processes permit applications for work in the following counties: Ada, Adams, Boise, Canyon, Elmore, Gem, Owyhee, Payette, Valley and Washington.
