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Corps reviews permit application for commercial development area near Boise

WALLA WALLA, Wash. – The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is reviewing an application requesting a Department of the Army permit for certain work in waters of the United States. The public notice regarding the permit application listed here was issued July 7, 2008.

Public Notice NWW-2008-340-B01, requested by Barber Station, Inc., proposes to discharge 9,854 cubic yards of clean gravel fill material into 1.02 acres of wetlands adjacent to the Boise River. The applicant intends to develop a mixed retail and commercial site within the 43-acre project area, which is located approximately 5 miles east of Boise, in Ada County, Idaho. The Corps of Engineers is soliciting comments from the public, federal, state and local agencies, Native American tribes and other interested parties on these permit requests.

The Corps issues or denies permits for the discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States under authority of Section 404 of the Clean Water Act and for work in or affecting navigable waters of the U.S. under Section 10 of the Rivers and Harbors Act of 1899.
