

a brief history of

Chiawana Park

*** Chiawana Park, located at Columbia River Mile 334 on the east river bank near Pasco, Wash., first opened to the public in 1968 and was leased to Franklin County for operation as a public day-use area.**

*** In the 1970s, additional Corps' land was added to the lease to provide a multi-user paved path east of the park to Road 54. Franklin County was operating the park and approximately 2 miles of paved path along the Columbia River.**

*** The county relinquished the majority of their leased area at the end of 2005, retaining only the Road 54 boat launch area**

*** In 2006, the City of Pasco and the Corps operated the park and shoreline under a Challenge Cost Share Agreement which enabled the City to better determine what their costs for future operation of the park and shoreline would be. This was done instead of closing the park and shoreline to public use as required by Corps' policy in the event of lease relinquishment.**


*** Operation under the Challenge Cost Share Agreement continued through 2007 as the Corps and the City worked to develop a lease agreement that would allow continued use of the area by over 250,000 visitors annually.**

Chiawana Park and the Columbia River shoreline offer Tri-City residents and visitors nearly 150 acres of shady lawn for relaxation and bright, sunny paved paths for walking, running or cycling along the Columbia River.

Chiawana Park offers a variety of facilities including several group picnic shelters, horse shoe pits, a childrens' playground, two restroom facilities, boat ramp, two courtesy boat docks, ample parking, almost 2 miles of walking paths and room to roam.

The park's day-use area is typically open from about April 1 through September 30. The park paths and boat ramp can be accessed year round. Picnic shelters may be reserved for group functions for a fee by contacting the City of Pasco Recreation Department at (509) 545-3456.

The Corps of Engineers will be replacing the courtesy boat dock on the west end of the park. The new fish-friendly and ADA-accessible dock is expected to be complete by the end of February. The City of Pasco has plans for future renovation of the playground on the east end of the park and the nearby restroom. Chiawana Park will open for the 2008 season on March 29.
